On-Call Field Technicians

Sk'atsin Resources is seeking qualified, enthusiastic individuals to join our team as On-Call Field Technicians for the upcoming field season.

This position reports to the Sk'atsin Projects Coordinator/Field Supervisor and to the General Manager.

Fuel management projects are beginning soon. Cultural heritage work may commence in May.

Summary:

Our team of On-Call Field Technicians are responsible for a wide variety of tasks. Field Technicians may perform duties related to all Sk'atsin Resources projects. This position will involve field work and labor work in all weather conditions.

Duties **may** include, but are **not** limited to:

1. Fuel Management
 - Use chainsaws, brush saws, power pruners, hand saws and other pieces of equipment to thin, prune and space in the forest landscape to reduce the risk of catastrophic wildfire.
 - Piling.
 - Burn piles and/or operate a mobile chipper to dispose of piles.
2. Cultural Heritage Assessments
 - Survey proposed forest blocks for Cultural resources (archaeological and environmental).
 - Fill out field cards.
3. Archeological, Construction and Environmental Monitoring
 - Observation and note taking.
 - Setting up and monitoring mitigation measures.
 - Monitoring site equipment.
 - Screening.
 - Project reporting.
4. Forestry
 - Block development.
 - Silviculture surveys.

5. Field labor
 - Fencing.
 - Brushing, spacing and pruning.
 - Light construction.
 - Painting, Cleaning.
6. Health & Safety:
 - Actively participate in Sk'atsin corporate Health and Safety program.
 - Assist in the development of Health and Safety related Policies and Procedures.
7. Other duties as required by the General Manager or the Project Coordinator/Field Supervisor.

Qualifications, Knowledge and Experience:

- Valid BC Class 5 Driver's License & drivers abstract is an asset.
- Knowledge of Secwepemc cultural and traditions is an asset.
- Resource Inventory Standards Committee Certification, (RISC) for archaeology is an asset.
- First Aid Level 1 and Transportation Endorsement Certification is an asset.
- Must be physically fit and willing/capable of working in all weather conditions.
